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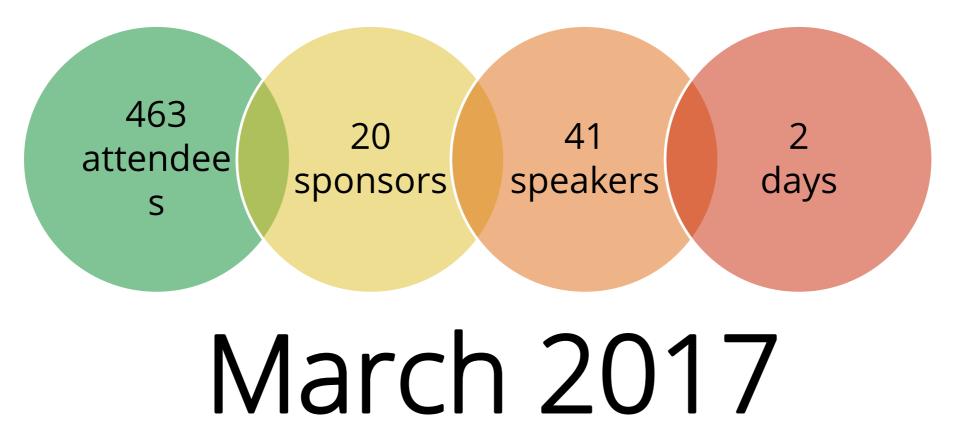

Content management system

A content management system (CMS)^{[1][2][3]} is a computer application that supports the creation and modification of digital content using a common user interface^[4] and thus usually supporting multiple users working in a collaborative environment.^[5] CMSes have been available since the late 1990s.

CMS features vary widely. Most CMSes include Web-based publishing, format management, edit history and version control, indexing, search, and retrieval. By their nature, content management systems support the separation of content and presentation.

Your Website and Your Revenue: If They Don't Buy Your Content, They Won't Buy Your Product

Before someone will buy your product, they have to "buy" your content. Your content is actually your *first product*, and should be viewed that way. If they don't like your free content, they won't pay for your product.



Most CEOs view content as something "out there," created by people who are not part of the strategic leadership team. They are just seen

as "do-bees": Marcom people, webmasters, copywriters, designers, and nerds. Quite often, there is no top executive responsible for the success of the website as a revenue-generator. The website, even though it is almost always the *only* contact point that the customer has with your company, is just not accorded the status it deserves.

How stupid! Even top executives, when they want to buy something, start with a Google search, and then click through sites like a hyperactive bee going from flower to flower.

Yet they treat their own sites as if no one was interested, no one was actively seeking information or trying to do something, and the people who did visit were not very smart. The most informative content – if there is any – is buried under confusing navigation and billboard images created by self-important

- Blog

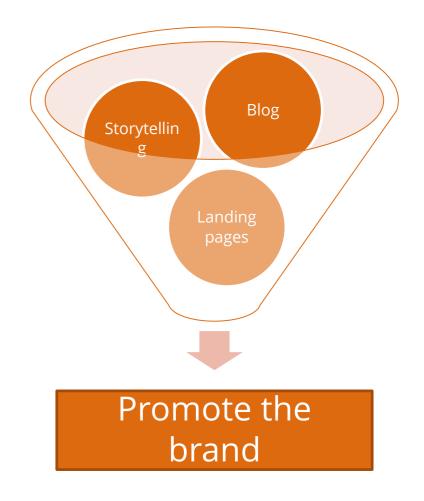

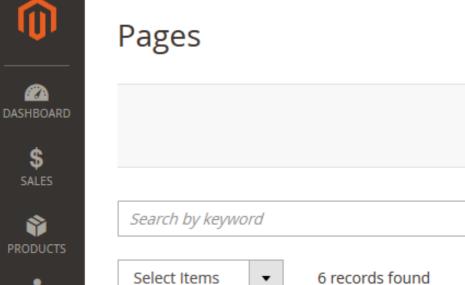

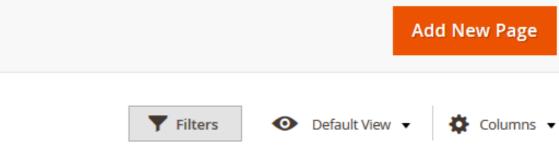

Content Blocks

A block is a modular unit of content that can be positioned most anywhere on the page. Content blocks are sometimes referred to as static blocks, or CMS blocks, and can be used to display fixed information such as text, images, and embedded video, as well as dynamic information from a widget or that originates in a database or other source. Most elements on the home page are blocks that can be easily managed.

You can create custom blocks of content without writing any code, and assign them to appear in a specific place in the page layout. Blocks can also be defined and positioned by making a layout update in XML code.

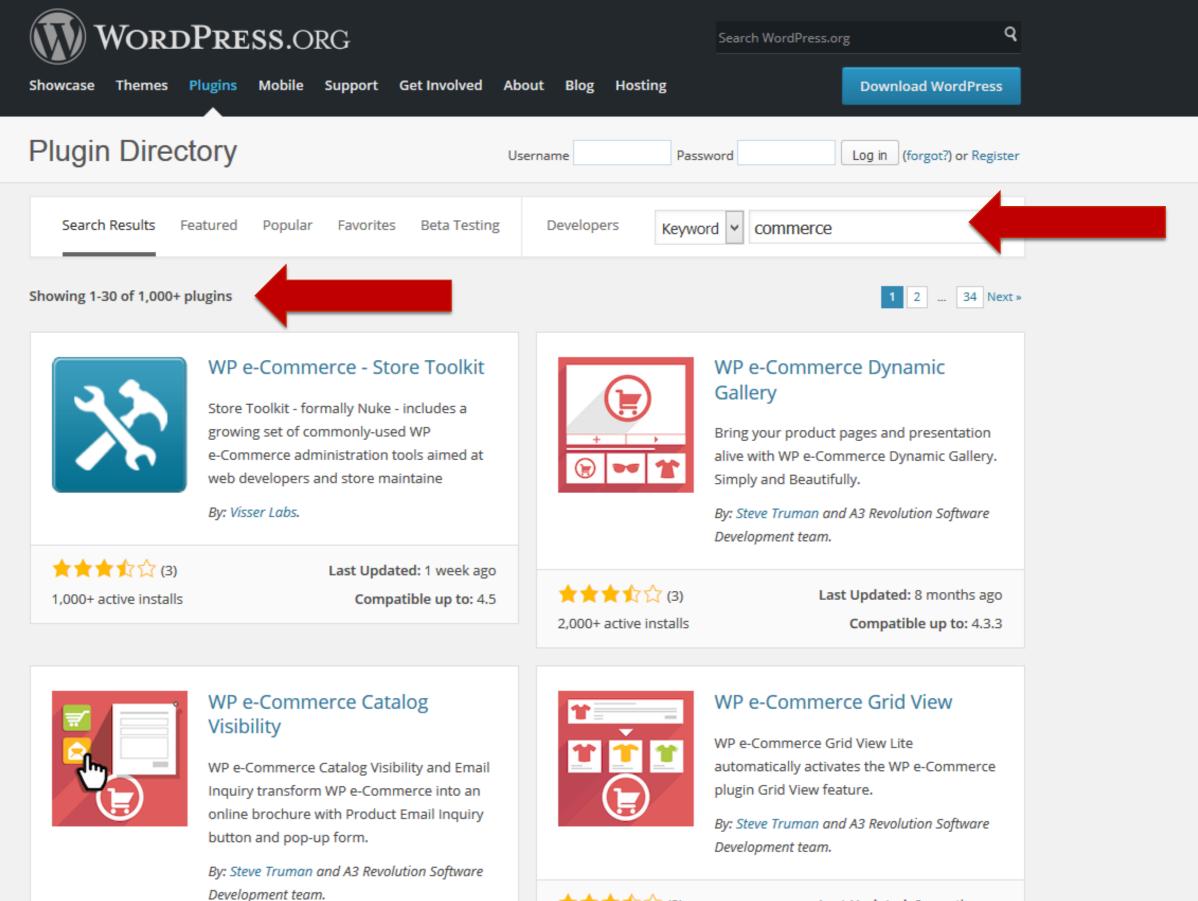

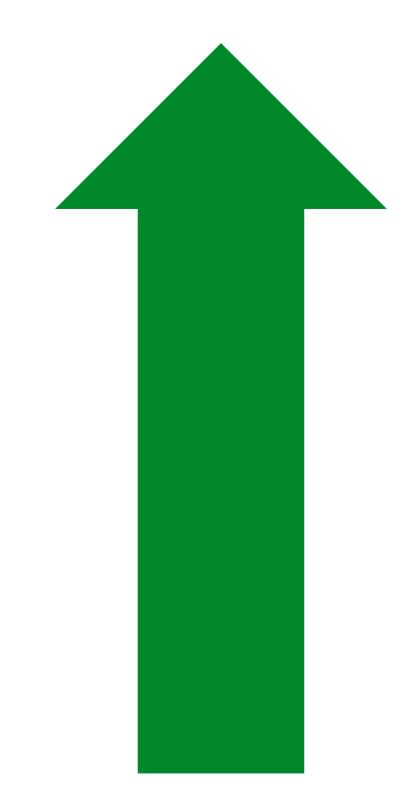

How integration works?



There are a lot of different solutions to integrate Wordpress

The most known one is Fishpig



Currently available for Magento 1 only

Magento 2 version coming soon! (thanks to Ben Tideswell for his work)





How Fishpig works

It provides a Magento module that reads contents from Wordpress database directly and provides content output through phtml files.

It also provides a new menu into Magento backoffice with shortcuts to Wordpress backoffice.

Wordpress is used as a backoffice system only.





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About this approach

- It allows editors to manage contents easly
- It allows to include products in blog posts and vice-versa
- It relieves you from customizing Wordpress theme
- It is based on the Magento principles
 - It is possible to install a few Wordpress plugins to enhance content functionalities



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There are a few TYPO3 plugins to integrate Magento and have limited functionalities

We implemented our own integration

This is how it works





How our Magento 2 – TYPO3 7 integration works

Magento and TYPO3 are both installed on the same server

TYPO3 instantiates Mage.php to get Magento contents

Magento calls TYPO3 pages to get editorial contents







A shared layout

Magento and TYPO3 share some layout components:

- Header
- Menu
- Footer

A Magento module allows to inject TYPO3 contents into ecommerce pages

A TYPO3 plugin allows to inject Magento contents into editorial pages

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Magento – TYPO3 SSO

- User registers via Magento registration
- User logins and logouts via Magento only
- After Magento login, the TYPO3 login action is called programmatically so user automatically logins into TYPO3 too
- Magento and TYPO3 databases are synchronized via SQL triggers





Application request routing

When a request comes in, who is in charge to manage it?

Two possibilities:

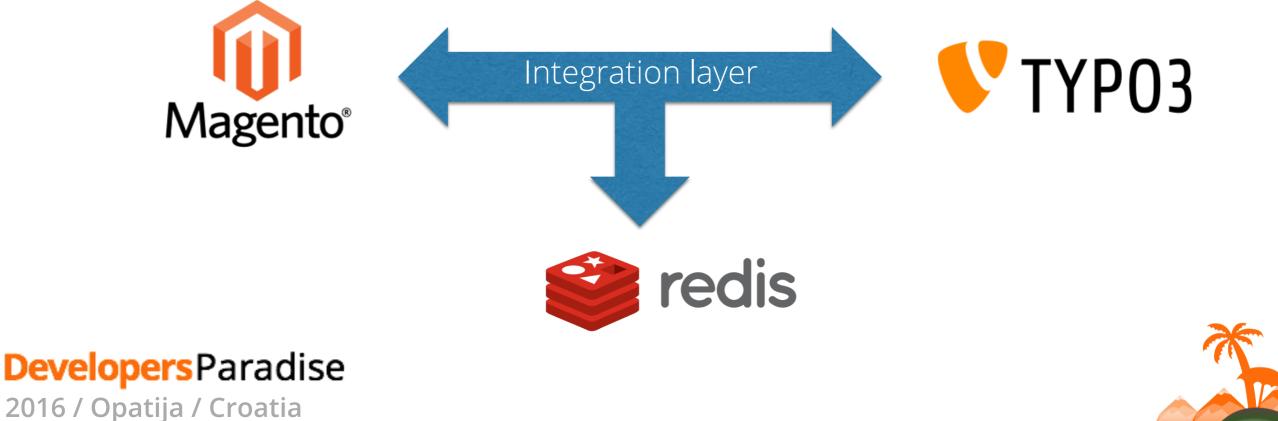
- All requests are primarly managed by Magento (or TYPO3) and passed through to the other platform if no routing applies (poor performances)
- Magento (or TYPO3) is installed in a subfolder so each platform manages its own requests only (it forces to have urls like this: <u>http://www.mywebsite.com/shop/</u>...)



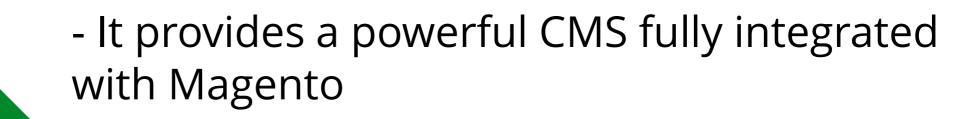


Caching

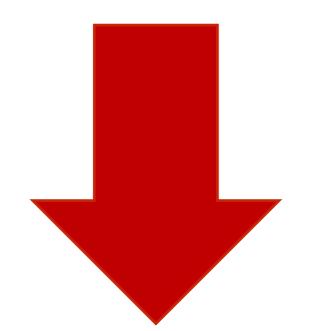
- Both Magento and TYPO3 have their own caching systems
- The integration layer has to integrate with both caching systems to locally cache contents provided by the other platform
- The integration layer has also its own caching system to avoid asking to both platforms the same content more than once



About this approach



- All TYPO3 functionalities and plugins can be used



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- It is necessary to implement a theme for TYPO3 too



Some other approaches



It allows you to add any Magento blocks to your WordPress theme, including ones you have created yourself, and static blocks created through the Magento admin area.

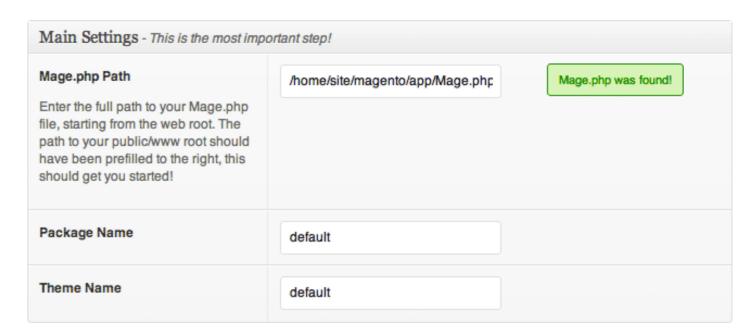

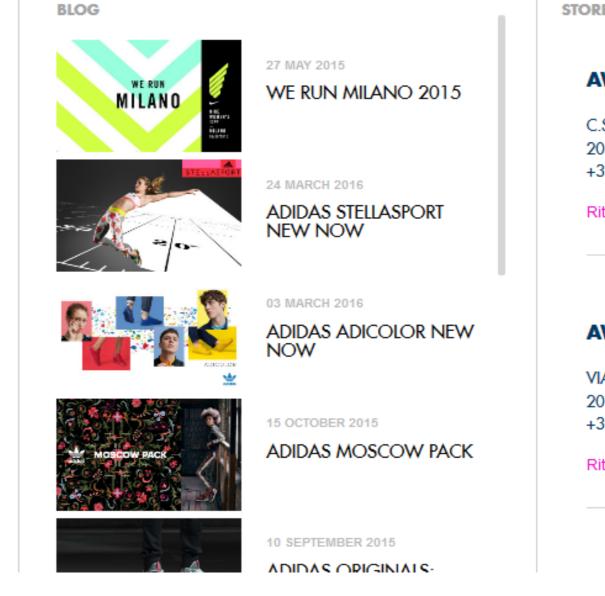
